



Tuesday, September 11th at 12:15 P.M. in the Fellowship Hall – The more hands we have, the quicker packing 100 kits will be completed. (It will take less than an hour!)

We greatly appreciate the toiletries that are collected on your vacations, business trips, or trips to Dollar General - Dollar Tree – CVS – etc..., and then dropped in our collection box located by the office. Please remember that the items need to be 'not used', as we don't want our homeless to feel like they are getting only the left-over's. (We are unable to use mouthwash bottles, due to possible alcohol ingredients.) We will also accept a monetary donation, as we usually have to buy nail clippers and some other items to complete the kits (put in the memo area of your check "Hygiene Kits").

If you have forgotten what we collect, here is a run-down of the list:

Travel Sized: shampoo, conditioner, soap, lotion, toothpaste **Other Needs**: Disposable razors, wide-tooth combs, toothbrushes, nail clippers, purse-size Kleenex packs and individually wrapped handi-wipes

CoC Packing Needs: Snack-size, Sandwich-size, and Gallon-size Ziploc bags

Thought For The Day... WHAT SPILLS OUT OF YOU??



Answering God's Call

How "Hygiene Kits for the Homeless" Ministry Got Started at Cross of Christ

As most of you know, my husband, Matt Rennhack, passed away in November of 2015. As those of you who have experienced the loss of a spouse are aware, this creates a whole new set of circumstances that those of us left behind have to figure out how to navigate.

One of these circumstances for me was the annual Christmas gathering of my husband's family. In December of 2016, all of them except for me, lived in South Carolina and their annual Christmas gathering was being held there, near Columbia. Ladies from our church had made very special gifts for me to give to his family for Christmas that year, so I needed to get there for this event. Flying from Chattanooga to Columbia was quite expensive, and at Christmas time had the potential for travel snafus. I did not want to drive that far by myself in the winter, so I decided to take the Greyhound bus. It was on this bus trip that God called me to help the homeless, and with all of your assistance, we have been doing the "Hygiene Kits for the Homeless" Ministry ever since.

When you travel by Greyhound bus, you do not have assigned seats. At Christmas time, there are a lot of people riding the bus, and it is quite an experience. On the return leg of my trip, between Atlanta and Chattanooga, there were few empty seats when I got onto the bus. I ended up getting a seat next to a young woman (since this is a relative term, she was in her early 30's or so) who was holding a white plastic bag on her lap (kitchen garbage size). I struck up conversation with her and learned that she had just been released from prison that very day, and everything she had in the world was in the white plastic bag, which was nearly empty. She told me that she had gone to prison because of a substance abuse problem, and had "gotten clean" in prison, but consequently had gained 80 pounds and the clothes that she had worn to prison (those in her bag) did not fit her. The prison had scrambled to find something for her to wear on the bus. She added that she had no idea as to how she was going to make it, but that she prayed every day for God's help.

I realized then that God had placed me there as that help. I told her about a thrift store that I had seen advertised on television that was in Ringgold (near where she was headed), where one could get as many clothes as would fit in a bag for \$5, and that perhaps she could go there to get some clothes. She replied that she had no money...the only things she had were a bottle of lotion and a comb or toothbrush, photos of her 3 children, clothes that did not fit, and a voucher for some food. I could not believe that they released people from prison with no money...it is no wonder there is such a high habitual relapse rate or so much homelessness amongst those who have gone to prison. God used this woman to open my eyes to a problem that I never even thought or knew about. I gave the woman some money and told her to go to the thrift store and/or Wal-Mart and get some clothes and other needed items...she was reluctant to take it from me, but thanked me profusely, which warmed my heart. I do not know the woman's name or how she is currently doing. I only know that her situation is what led me to ask Pastor and our LWML if we could assemble "Hygiene Kits for the Homeless" to help needy people, like this young woman, have a chance at success when life does not appear to be very promising.

Your donations of shampoo, soap, lotion, toothbrushes, and other hygiene items that you collect at hotels or dentists, or purchase and donate, enable us to continue with this ministry. Your support of our fundraising theme dinners (our Italian night and our Mexican Fiesta) provides money we use to purchase socks and other items, which we include in these kits when we do not have enough of an item donated for each kit to have all of the items. The hygiene kits that we assemble (and will be assembling again on Tuesday, September 11th at 12:15 p.m. in Fellowship Hall) are distributed to the homeless through the Chattanooga Community Kitchen, where the homeless go to take showers and get meals.

I know God called me to this mission... with your help we have been able to make a difference in the lives of many of God's needy people in our community.



Great peace have they who love your law, and nothing can make them stumble. Psalms 119:165

Are you easily upset? Even over little things? Spend more time praying and reading your Bible.

The following article turned up in a newspaper: 'A lady took my seat in church. She's very nice...a good friend, in fact. I can sit anyplace; no big deal. My seat's on the right as you enter the sanctuary. I can rest my arm on the end. It's a good seat, but I wouldn't raise a fuss about a seat...never hold a grudge. Actually, it was three months ago she took it and I really don't know why. I've never done anything to her...never taken her seat. I suppose I'll have to come an hour early to get my seat. She took it because it's one of the best seats in the house. She'd no business taking it...and I'm not going to church two hours early to get what's rightfully mine. This is the way social injustices begin: abusive people taking other people's seats. It's the way seeds of revolution are sown. A person can only stand so much. Where's it all going to end? If somebody doesn't stand up and be counted, nobody's seat will be safe. People will sit anywhere they please, and next time they'll take my parking place. World order will be in a shambles!'

We smile, but it's amazing how quickly we get bent out of shape when our little routine is disrupted. Do you know why the Christian life is described as 'the high calling' (Philippians 3:14)? Because it means taking the high road and serving others, rather than taking the low road and putting ourselves first.
