MORE THAN DOING WITHOUT

Yes, as hard as it may be to believe this fact: the Lenten season begins in just two (2) weeks! The impact of this means that from Ash Wednesday, on February 17th, through Good Friday, on April 2nd, hundreds of millions of Christians around the globs will be reflecting on the suffering and death of our Savior and Lord.

Certainly, it is a very special time for us; and even though we celebrate the cycle each year, the Holy Spirit urges us to never tire of our meditation and focus on Christ's Passion. For many according to tradition, Lent is a time to "give up something" (maybe red meat, desserts, celebrations, etc.) as a vivid reminder of all that our Savior gave up for us. Unfortunately, those denials may last no longer than New Year's resolutions. So I'm asking you, for Lent in 2021, to try <u>adding</u> something to your daily and weekly regimen.

What about setting a goal to worship in God's House every week over the next month-and-a-half? (The number of extra Lent and Holy Week services will be determined at next week's Elders' Meeting.) What about setting a goal for yourself of bringing a friend or neighbor with you for a Sunday or special mid-week service? What about using your Lenten devotional booklet in addition to your regular devotion... maybe one in the morning and the other at night? What about putting aside a dollar or two in a jar, maybe in the middle of your dinner table, as a daily reminder of all the "good things" with which our Heavenly Father fills our lives week-by-week?

Obviously, the list of things you and I might be doing in response to God's love for us could go on and on, but what is most important is that you establish your <u>own</u> list of special things for Lent. Begin your list today, and from now until Ash Wednesday ask the Holy Spirit to help you be as faithful in following through on your resolve as Jesus was in fulfilling everything necessary for our salvation.

May Almighty God bless us and empower you and me for this joyful and rewarding task!

Ash Wednesday


If you haven't yet looked at your calendar for February, this is your official notice that Lent begins on **February 17**th.

Why we lament...

In 2020, the coronavirus pandemic struck America during the middle of Lent, a season associated with deprivation. Some people made light of the shutdowns, joking, "I didn't mean to give up *this* much for Lent!" Others asked why the suffering was occurring in the first place.

Professor N.T. Wright, in an essay for *Time*, explains that asking "why?" but receiving no answer is key to biblical lamenting. Adding to the mystery, he says, is that God also laments — grieving at the wickedness of humans, despairing over Israel's unfaithfulness. Jesus cries at a friend's tomb; the Holy Spirit groans in anguish. "Part of the Christian vocation," Wright concludes, is not being able to explain why but lamenting instead. "As the Spirit laments within us," he says, "so we become, even in our self-isolation, small shrines where the presence and healing love of God can dwell. And out of that there can emerge new possibilities ... new hope."



Lutheran World Relief CARE-VAN Drive 2020

2020 has been a year of challenges, but that didn't slow down our congregation ladies from stepping up to the plate! Even with several congregations/ quilters unable to meet due to COVID-19 we had another great ingathering.

At this year's Lutheran World Relief CARE-VAN ingathering the Mid-South District once again had seven drop sites where we collected handmade quilts, school kits, personal care kits, baby care kits, and fabric kits. Our drop sites included Christus Victor, Knoxville, TN.; Cross of Christ, Chattanooga, TN.; Our Savior, Nashville, TN.; Immanuel, Memphis, TN.; First, Fort Smith, AR.; Grace, Little Rock, AR.; Salem, and Springdale, AR.

At the time of this report (12/21/2020), the top three quilt producing congregations that dropped off their work at an LWR CARE-VAN ingathering site were Zion Lutheran Church, Alexander, AR (195 quilts), St. Paul Lutheran Church, Gillett, AR (116 quilts), and Faith Lutheran Church, Hot Springs Village, AR (110 quilts). A total of 2,025 quilts (580 were from several area ELCA congregations) were donated.

To date we had 42 congregations participate (7 ELCA), collecting over \$4,400 for shipping costs. We also collected 2,017 personal care kits, 64 fabric kits, 904 school kits, 433 baby care kits, and 85 face masks were also donated. The CARE-VAN trailers were loaded up with 621 boxes (weighing approximately 13,731 pounds!) of offerings from District congregations for Lutheran World Relief. Way to go Mid-South District!

Many of the congregations' efforts are coordinated by LWML groups and longstanding quilting groups in the congregations. They participate in this effort to share the love of Christ in a personal way. The tireless efforts of those who share their talents and the generous contributions of many make this a successful ingathering.

Thank you to all who participated in this year's annual LWR CARE-VAN drive!

Can You Help the Homeless With Items In Your Closets or Drawers??

Please consider donating your used clothing towards the homeless. **Winter items** (jackets, hats, gloves...) along with **all other articles of clothing** are needed, any size

(except no items for babies or toddlers needed). All clothing <u>MUST</u> be clean and in good condition, '<u>NO</u>' mending needed. Purses, bags, shoes, belts, etc.... are also welcome. The season of clothes you bring does not matter when you donate them, as everything and anything is needed for our homeless community.

Other possible donations which are needed this time of the year are **blankets & pillows**, **sleeping bags**, **and vinyl tarps. We also take donations of furniture and household items in GOOD condition**. Sack up or box up anything you, your spouse, or your kids have outgrown and bring it to the church. (Please be sure that the sack or box is <u>light enough</u> to be carried by someone like Arlene or Lorilynn!)

Plan on doing some spring cleaning of your home? We will also take kitchenware, wall décor, lamps, bedding, towels, anything you might use to set up a house (or that will fit into the back of Arlene's SUV!), as we also help those who now are able to get into an apartment or rental. All items <u>MUST</u> be useable and in non-damaged condition.

Put clothing or household items in a box, bag, or basket and bring them to church. **PLEASE** <u>do not</u> make the boxes, bags, or baskets heavy or overstuff them. (It would be better to make 2 bags than 1 giant one.) Items can be left under the table by the church office where they will be picked up and distributed to those in need.

Arlene Vickers will get all the above to various homeless agencies with which she deals. Thank you in advance for your sharing of clothing and household items with others. You are blessing others in a way that cannot be measured.

WEEKLY RESERVATIONS CONTINUE...

As a reminder, for the foreseeable future, **PLEASE** call the church office to make reservations for Private Holy Communion on Wednesday <u>or</u> Saturday afternoon <u>-or-</u> if you plan to attend either worship service on Saturday or Sunday.

It is very important for the church office to receive your call, especially for Holy Communion, as there are only so many open slots for communion (scheduled for every 20 minutes). In addition, we can only accomodate so many people per worship service (due to the 6 ft. social distancing guidelines). At this time we are limited to 45 people per service.

Making your reservations helps the church office to complete the lists needed each weekend for Pastor and the Ushers. *Since COVID began, we now have a new way of keeping attendance for the Synod. When you call in, you are helping Lorilynn to complete the necessary paperwork needed.* (You can also think of it as our way of contact tracing, should someone come down with COVID within the church.)

The guidelines below apply for making your reservations for Holy Communion and our worship services by the noted day and time each week.

Wednesday Holy Communion (by <u>11am, Wednesday</u>) Saturday Holy Communion (by <u>Noon on Thursday</u>) Saturday evening worship (6pm) - (by <u>Noon on Thursday</u>) Sunday morning worship (9am) – (by <u>Noon on Thursday</u>)

Should you desire Private Holy Communion at a time different than noted above, please call the church office and speak to Pastor or Lorilynn. (Please be aware... if you accidentally forget to call in and make your reservation, you are still welcome to attend either service. Keep in mind that the Saturday service usually has a few more open seats than Sunday.)

The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod LCMS Stewardship Ministry February 2021

"I am not commanding you, but I want to test the sincerity of your love by comparing it with the earnestness of others. For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, so that you through his poverty might become rich" (2 Corinthians 8:8-9).

Without commands or even arm-twisting, St. Paul encourages, even challenges, the Church in Corinth to demonstrate the sincerity of their faith by their generosity in giving. He does this because giving generously is a gift of the Spirit given to us through the Gospel. St. Paul wrote: "But just as you excel in everything—in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in complete earnestness and in your love for us—see that you also excel in this grace of giving" (2 Corinthians 8:7). In other words, just as we grow in faith and speech and knowledge of eternal things by the Holy Spirit through the Word of God, so also do we grow in giving from the same Spirit through the same Word.

The problem is that the grace of generosity often grows cold in us. It's not so much that we stop giving, but we don't put it first. We treat it like all the other bills that must be paid. It becomes a chore, just one more thing to check off a list of things to do. That empties it of its spiritual power and robs us of the joy that Christ and the Scriptures assign to it.

On top of that, since this generosity is linked to faith and knowledge of divine things, a lack of excelling in giving is sure sign that our faith and knowledge of God are under attack as well.

Thus St. Paul points to the foundation of generosity: the generosity of Christ Himself. Even though He was rich, He became poor so that we who are poor might become rich. Thus, the incarnation, suffering, and death of our Lord on the cross is the reason, source, and driving force for our generosity in giving to the church.

And since Christ who was rich became poor so that we might be rich in His grace—of which generous giving is part—so we also who are rich in His grace can excel in pressing His grace into service toward the gracious work of the church.

Pay attention to what you give to the church so that you may excel at it. And if you find that your heart has grown cold or indifferent toward it, immerse yourself in God's Word. Read it at home. Attend Bible Class. Hear and listen to it preached in the Divine Service. Be reminded of what Christ has done for you in His incarnation, suffering, and death. For this will strengthen your faith and knowledge. And where that excels, so will the grace of giving excel also.

Cross of Christ has been blessed with no COVID cases from within the church walls. We are hoping to continue this trend and ask for your help:

Within the last 48 hours of walking into the church for ANY service or meeting, please ask yourself these FIVE (5) questions:

1) Have you been in close contact with... <u>someone being</u> <u>tested</u> for COVID and <u>waiting for</u> the results -or- someone who <u>tested positive</u> (a confirmed case) for COVID-19? Have you traveled to a hot spot of COVID-19?

2) Have you had a recent loss of taste or smell?

3) Are you <u>experiencing</u> a cough, shortness of breath, sore throat, or any <u>symptoms</u> of COVID-19?

4) Have you had a fever within the last 48 hours? If so, you <u>MUST be fever free for 48 hours</u> before coming back into the church.

5) Have you had vomiting or diarrhea in the last 24 hours, or <u>felt sick or not like yourself</u>?

If you answered YES to <u>any</u> of the above questions, we ask that you please REMAIN AT HOME and contact your physician.

We will continue with the guidelines that <u>everyone</u> <u>MUST</u> wear a face mask when coming into the church or administration building, while attending Private Holy Communion, worship services, or attending any gathering held on the church premises, for the foreseeable future. (Even our quilters are wearing them the whole time they are putting together quilts, as is our organist and our A/V team!) **Please make sure that the mask covers your whole nose, mouth, and chin area at all times.**

Remember to tell yourself... I AM WEARING A MASK NOT BECAUSE I AM ILL, BUT BECAUSE <u>I CARE FOR YOU</u> 'AND' <u>FOR ALL HEALTHCARE WORKERS</u> PUTTING THEIR LIVES ON THE LINE DAILY AND WORKING LONG HOURS! The last thing we want is a resurgence of this silent killer.

Please know that the Elders, Trustees, and church staff are doing everything they can for the health, safety and wellbeing of our members and your families. We will continue to evaluate further re-opening plans, taking into consideration the current impact of the virus in our community, and the future steps which can be taken for our church to continue to move forward in a safe manner.

God wants us to choose to love him freely, even when that choice involves pain, because we are committed to him, not to our own good feelings and rewards. He wants us to cleave to him, as Job did, even when we have every reason to deny him hotly. That, I believe, is the central message of Job.

Satan had taunted God with the accusation that humans are not truly free. Was Job being faithful simply because God had allowed him a prosperous life? Job's fiery trials proved the answer beyond doubt. Job clung to God's justice when he was the best example in history of God's apparent injustice. He did not seek the Giver because of his gifts; when all gifts were removed, he still sought the Giver.

that comes from the gospel of peace. 16 In addition to all this, take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one. 17 Take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.

18 And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the Lord's people.


Once a year, an individual honoree is chosen and celebrated at the site of this historic home. **In 2021, for the first time, a charity group will be honored as well.**

The group they have chosen to be the first recipient of the Crystal Thimble Award for its outstanding contribution is the Lutheran World Relief Mission Quilters.

Words from the Hall of Fame announcement: "This award is to recognize not-for-profit organizations that have had a significant impact in the world of quilt making. In 2021 we will present the award to Lutheran World Relief (LWR) Mission Quilts for their impact in the world of quilting. In the days and weeks after a disaster, LWR is on the ground helping to meet people's immediate needs. And in the months and years following, they are dedicated to working to ensure communities can rebuild better and stronger than before.

A major part of the help LWR provides is their Mission Quilts. These quilts are highly regarded throughout the world because of their quality and consistency. From LWR's first quilts in 1945, given to families in war-torn Europe, to today's annual average world distribution of 300,000 quilts, it's clear why the Lutheran World Relief has been chosen for the Crystal Thimble Award in 2021."

A small, but faithful group of women at Cross of Christ, have dedicated themselves for years to meeting every Tuesday (9:30-11:30 a.m.) and make quilts for Lutheran World Relief.
