"ADVENT ACCENTS"

We are now into the season of Advent – a time of waiting and preparation, hope and expectation – which the Christian Church has observed since at least the sixth century. We, and other churches around the globe, begin a new church year with this four-week time of coming-to or arriving (derived from the Latin word "adventus"), awaiting both the arrival of Jesus' birth and His Second Coming.

Therefore, in our Sunday morning and Wednesday evening services, our hymns, readings, and messages reflect this "in-between period" in the Church's history. Now obviously, if it were not for Christ's death and resurrection, as was foreshadowed by the first Gospel reading of the season, there would be no reason to celebrate Advent. Nor would the birth of a little boy in a stable in Bethlehem have been recorded or conveyed so much significance. But the fact is that Jesus' life, death, and final victory over the grave have changed history and countless lives forever. Accordingly, we risk losing the special meaning of this season of preparation if we fail to consider the nature and meaning of various Advent practices or if we move too quickly into a Christmas-focused on gifts and presents.

Take for example the Advent wreath with its evergreen branches, symbolizing to us as Christians, the never-failing love of God for us and the ever-lasting life found in Jesus Christ. Often the evergreen wreath is interspersed with springs of holly, whose thorny leaves and blood red berries provide a somber foreshadowing of our Savior's Passion, even as we move during this time toward the joyous celebration of His birth. (If you are interested in more history and details on Advent traditions, please pick up a copy of HISTORY, CUSTOMS. & USE OF THE ADVENT WREATH from the Usher's hutch in the Narthex.) The wreath's shape points us to God's eternal nature, without beginning or end. Finally, the four candles remind us, in order, of the four weeks of preparation: the "Prophecy Candle" underscoring all the Old Testament prophecies of Messiah's arrival; the "Bethlehem" Candle" pointing us to the place of Jesus' birth; the pink "Shepherd Candle" reflecting the joy in the hearts of the shepherds as they heard the good news of the Savior's birth; and the "Angel Candle" heralding this historic event and hinting at their return on the Last Day, when the King of Kings will come again.

All members, young and old, teens – young adults – older adults, are invited to join us in the annual event!


Calling All (acoustical) Guitarists at Cross of Christ

CHATTANOOGA COMMUNITY KITCHEN ~~ FAST DAY ~~

Cross of Christ is a member church of the Board of the Chattanooga Community Kitchen (CCK) (this is the organization to which we send the hygiene kits we assemble for the homeless). As a Board member church, we are highly encouraged to support activities of the CCK to help the homeless in our community. The largest and most important annual fundraising activity for the CCK is 'Fast Day', which began in 1989, with the idea that those wanting to help our area's homeless should fast for one meal and donate whatever they would have spent on that meal to the CCK. Since then the concept of 'Fast Day' has grown to become an opportunity for churches, individuals and businesses to donate whatever they can afford to the ministry and mission of the CCK any time of year, but particularly in October, November and December.

THINK IT'S TO LATE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE ANNUAL 'Fast-day Event' SPONSORED BY THE CHATTANOOGA COMMUNITY KITCHEN (CCK)?? Well, you would be wrong, as this annual fundraiser goes through December! Can you give the amount you would have spent by skipping a meal or maybe a day's worth of meals? Going to Subway for lunch amounts to around \$7.00 for one person. If each family in our church gave \$7.00, our donation would amount to \$784.00 or if each member in our church gave \$7.00, our donation would amount to over \$1,500. Think of what that money could do for CCK!

David Costellow, Director of Community Engagement at CCK was present on November 17th at Pastor's Bible Class. David noted that all donations benefit homeless men, women and children in the Chattanooga area who are in need of food, shelter, clothing and other necessities of life and your donation is tax-deductible. A handout & envelope will be available this weekend (December 21st and 22nd) at our worship services. More gift envelopes for CCK are available on the back table in the Narthex.

Donations can be brought to the church and left under the table located in front of the church office, where they will be picked up and distributed to the homeless. STEWARDSHIP CORNER

END OF YEAR TAX IDEAS... GIVE A LASTING GIFT!

The Lord has truly blessed us beyond comprehension. Continuing the mission of our Christian Faith, by our weekly contributions to Cross of Christ Lutheran Church, definitely assists us with our responsibility to go out into all the world and share that eternal life gospel! We want to be sure our Church's presence in Chattanooga will continue to fund missions at home and abroad. There are several ways to ensure this can happen.

Cross of Christ has a special account that is used to support the day-to-day operations of the church, which is provided by members who want to save on their state and federal taxes by making a gift of appreciated securities directly to the church. This account is referred to as the LPL Account. Members will receive an immediate income tax deduction for the value of the security on the date of transfer, no matter what was originally paid for them with the benefit of PAYING NO CAPITAL GAINS TAX. Appreciated securities would include stocks, bonds, or mutual fund shares that you have owned for more than one year. Contact Lorilynn in the church office if you would like to gift some stock funds.

In our retirement years, we begin thinking about those Individual Retirement Accounts (IRA's) that many folks have set up years ago for our "golden years"! Before you make arrangements for IRA withdrawals, discover how you and Cross of Christ can benefit from the IRA CHARITABLE ROLLOVER. This way of support to the church is an easy and convenient way to make a gift from one of your major assets. It is excluded from your gross income, as a tax-free rollover and counts toward your required minimum distribution. The requirements are that you are at least 70 1/2 years old at the time of the gift and the transfer must go directly from your IRA to Cross of Christ Lutheran Church.

Another easy and simple way to carry on the church's mission and ministry is to consider leaving the Church in your Will. By remembering Cross of Christ in your Will or the other mentioned estate plans above, you could receive important tax benefits while supporting the work of the church, and leaving a legacy of providing the gospel message to future generations, through our local and foreign missions. Please consult with a tax professional or broker on these suggestions or call the church office and we will arrange for additional professional assistance.

HYGIENE KITS FOR THE HOMELESS

Traveling over the holidays?? Please continue to drop toiletries collected on your vacations, business trips, etc.... in our collection box located by the church office. Remember that the items need to be 'not used'. (We are also unable to use mouthwash bottles, due to possible alcohol ingredients.)

If you have forgotten what we collect, here is a brief run-down of the list or pick up the small size list to put in your purse or wallet:

Travel Sized: shampoo, conditioner, soap, lotion, toothpaste

Other Needs: Disposable razors, wide-tooth combs, toothbrushes, nail clippers, individually wrapped handi-wipes, & purse-size Kleenex packs CoC Packing Needs: Snack-size, Sandwich-size, and Gallon-size Ziploc bags

We will also accept monetary donations, as we run into having a short supply of some items. Especially at this time of the year when we add chap-stick, cough drops, and warm socks to the kits. ELECTRONIC GIVING... DOES MY DONATION HAVE ANY FEES TAKEN OUT, AS I WANT MY CHURCH TO GET 100% OF THE FUNDS?? This is a frequent question we have been getting after we introduced Vanco Solutions to our members for electronic giving. There is no charge to you, the giver of a donation, regardless if it is a one-time special gift or a recurring monthly donation. Vanco does not deduct a user fee from your donation. 100% of your donation goes to the church! (The church does get charged a minor monthly fee, but that fee is a budgeted amount and is very minimal in price.) Unfortunately, at this time <u>we are unable to accept credit cards deductions</u>, as there is a considerable charge for this service to the church.

When using Vanco Solutions, you won't have to remember if you donated last week or last month, especially helpful if you are traveling. Why not, you may be asking... because electronic donations/gifts to the church are automatically taken care of for you. It's three (3) easy steps... Step 1) Select where you want your funds taken from (your checking or savings account); Step 2) Decide on the frequency of your donation (weekly and you name the day, or monthly on the 1st or the 15th); and Step 3) Where do you want to designate your donation to be credited toward (or you can divide your donation among different areas – i.e. part to the General Operating Fund, part to the Building Fund, part to Missions, etc...)

Forms are on the table in the back of the Narthex. You can drop off your completed form (in a sealed envelope) at the church office, mail it to the church office (Attn: Barbara Wyatt) or hand it directly to Barbara. Should you have

If you have never delivered a Thanksgiving Basket to someone the week of Thanksgiving, you have missed the grateful words shared, the smiles, the hugs, and sometimes tears, of those with little or nothing to provide to their loved ones for a Thanksgiving meal.

That is just a taste of the emotions you see when the baskets are delivered to our neighbors that need some assistance at this time of the year. Thank you to all who brought items for the Thanksgiving Baskets, who gave us a \$250.00 Thrivent card to buy the turkeys, milk, bread, and other fresh items, to those that helped sort and pack, and last, but definitely not least, to those who delivered these baskets.

We, at Cross of Christ, are so richly blessed to be able to share what God has given us with others in our community in the way of a simple Thanksgiving Basket. But to those we deliver it to, it is not just a Thanksgiving Basket. It's food for their children in the way of peanut butter and jelly sandwiches, it's milk for cereal and those toddlers who are still using sippy cups, it's a traditional meal to be shared with loved ones or friends, left-overs for more meals and so much more; it's a kind church and congregation remembering them.

The congregation would like to thank the quilters for all their hard work and the beautiful quilts made throughout the year. We especially want to thank you for the Christmas quilts. They were beautiful!!

Lutheran World Relief CARE-VAN Drive 2019

At this year's Lutheran World Relief CARE-VAN ingathering the Mid-South District had seven drop sites collecting handmade quilts, school kits, personal care kits, baby care kits, fabric kits and boxes of soap, the weekend of Nov. 1st & 2nd. Our drop sites included Christus Victor, Knoxville, TN; *Cross of Christ, Chattanooga, TN*; Our Savior, Nashville, TN; Immanuel, Memphis, TN; First, Fort Smith, AR; Grace, Little Rock, AR; and Salem, Springdale, AR.

At the time of this report (11/20/2019), the top three quilt-producing congregations that dropped off their work at an LWR CARE-VAN ingathering site were Zion Lutheran Church, Alexander, AR (192 quilts); First Lutheran, Chattanooga, TN (106 quilts) and St. Paul, Wartburg, TN (103 quilts). A total of 1,643 quilts (270 were from several area ELCA congregations) were donated.

To date we had 43 congregations participate (3 ELCA), collecting over \$4,000 for shipping costs. We also collected 1,222 personal care kits, 171 fabric kits, 731 school kits, 104 baby care kits, 16 fleece blankets and 12 boxes of soap. The CARE-VAN loaded up with 525 boxes (weighing approximately 10,300 pounds!) of offerings from District congregations for Lutheran World Relief. Way to go Mid-South District!

Many of the congregations' efforts are coordinated by LWML groups and longstanding quilting groups in the congregations. They participate in this effort to share the love of Christ in a personal way. The tireless efforts of those who share their talents and the generous contributions of many make this a successful ingathering.

Thank you to all who participated in this year's annual LWR CARE-VAN drive!

November 10th was a special day for our congregation, as we had a surprise celebration for the 25 years of having Pastor Barry Hildebrandt shepherd the flock at Cross of Christ Lutheran Church. We are so grateful for the everything he has taught us, blessed us with, and carried us through. May God continue to walk with him as he witnesses to us and the community.

Facility Improvements Update

The following building improvement expenditures were authorized by the Voters' Assembly at the <u>September 2018</u> <u>meeting</u>, <u>exactly as noted</u> (some changes & plans to move forward were made at later Voters' meetings). Here's an update of where we stand (items crossed out have been completed)...

- 1. Gutter Guards: up to \$5500 for leaf quards to be installed on the back of the church building (COMPLETED)
- 2. Window Reglazing: up to \$5760 to scrape rust, reglaze, seal and paint, as applicable, all windows except those in the Sanctuary (COMPLETED)
- 3. Interior Electrical Work: up to \$6000 to correct electrical issues in the Sanctuary, Narthex, Back Stairwell and Kitchen (COMPLETED)
- 4. Architectural Services: \$1200 to pay the architect for designing handicap accessibility improvements (COMPLETED)
- 5. Tree Work: up to \$2500 to evaluate trees on the church property and remove any dead limbs, etc. (COMPLETED)
- 6. Handicap Accessible Bathrooms/Repurposing Spaces: up to \$25,000 for 2 handicap accessible "family bathrooms" (1 per floor) and for expenses associated with moving Pastor's Bible Class (BATHROOMS ARE COMPLETED and USEABLE! Contractors working on the final punch list items.)
- 7. Lift for Handicap Accessibility: begin a fundraising campaign for up to \$84,500 to install an interior lift between the floors, with main floor access location in the corridor near Ms. Hamilton's Room and Pastor's Office and ground floor access in the nursery, adjacent to the kitchen on the ground floor (Fundraising Campaign to begin in early 2019) (LIFT IS COMPLETED and USEABLE AS OF LAST WEEKEND! Contractors working on the final punch list items.)

The contractors are striving to complete their final punch list items by the end of the year! Adult Sunday School will begin meeting in the Fellowship Hall starting January 5th. We will be asking for volunteers in January, to help with some deep cleaning projects (especially of toys and wiping down books in the Nursery and Mrs. Hamilton's room), painting walls in the Nursery, moving furniture back to their respective rooms and other small tasks to complete the rooms and return classrooms back to normal. (There have been many pictures taken throughout these projects and they will eventually be put into a scrap book for everyone to check out.)

Thank you to everyone who has been helping with our projects this past year.

The end is in sight and it looks good!
