CHATTANOOGA COMMUNITY KITCHEN FAST DAY

Cross of Christ Lutheran Church is a member church on the Board of the Chattanooga Community Kitchen (CCK). (CCK *is the organization to which we send the hygiene kits we assemble for the homeless and where we also help serve a meal once a month*). As a board member church, we are highly encouraged to support activities of the CCK to help the homeless in our community. **The largest and most** *important annual fundraising activity for the CCK is "Fast Day"*. *"Fast Day" began in 1984 with the notion that anyone could fast for a meal and donate what would have been spent on the meal toward* CCK and their work (feeding and housing those on the streets). Since that time, the "Fast Day" campaign has grown to be the primary source of funds for CCK services – it is the lifeblood of the work they undertake.

Each year, the Chattanooga Community Kitchen asks our community (churches, individuals and businesses) to help change lives by fasting (physically, spiritually or symbolically) for a meal... a day, a week, or more, and donating the cost to the Community Kitchen. You can give any time of year, but particularly around Thanksgiving week do we find it more meaningful to give to others that have little or none.

Please help out as much as you are able, to this ministry and mission. Help to change lives! *There will be envelopes for direct contributions to the CCK available in the Nov.* 17th *bulletin and they are also available at the church for you to pickup. You may also write a check to the church and put "CCK Fast Day" in the "memo" line.*

On Sunday, November 17th David Costellow, Director of Community Engagement at CCK, will be present at Pastor's Bible Class. He will speak about the multiple activities undertaken by the CCK to help the homeless; including but not limited to providing meals, shelter, showering facilities, a Thrift Store for clothing and other essentials, medical care, educational classes and other support to the homeless. Please attend this educational session so you can learn about the important services this organization provides.

You are also invited to tour the Chattanooga Community Kitchen facilities, in order to gain a better understanding of their daily workings. You can then see for yourself how they are able to serve so many of our homeless community.

BBQ Chickens: Thank you to all who helped prepare, cook, and sell the BBQ chickens this past weekend. We sold 200 chickens! (That's 400 halves that were grilled, smoked, and taken home to eat.) We hope to have the financial info. soon, once all the invoices have been received and paid, so we can let you know the amount donated to our chosen charities.

Trunk or Treat: We thank the volunteers who showed up on a cold evening to hand out candy and for those members that brought candy to share. Our headcount was only around 80 children, but they appeared to have fun in their costumes (see pictures elsewhere). Come rain or snow, hot or cold temperatures, the kids came out!

PACKING DATE CHANGE: Due to construction schedules, we have had to reschedule... we will now be packing Hygiene Kits for the Homeless on Tuesday, November 12th after quilting (12:00 noon). Everyone is welcome to come and help... it only takes about 30 minutes to pack 100 kits if we have several helpers. Your continued support of this ministry is greatly appreciated!!

Please continue to drop off toiletries collected on your vacations, business trips, or a visit to Dollar General - Dollar Tree – etc... in our collection box located by the church office. Remember that the items need to be '*not used*', as we don't want our homeless to feel like they are getting left-over products. (We are also unable to use bottles of mouthwash, due to possible alcohol ingredients.)

If you have forgotten what we collect, here is a brief rundown (or pick up the "pink" wallet sized list by the collection box):

Travel Sized: shampoo, conditioner, soap, lotion, toothpaste

Other Needs: disposable razors, wide-tooth combs, toothbrushes, nail clippers, purse-size Kleenex packs and "individually wrapped" handi-wipes (usually 20-50 in a box) **CoC Packing Needs**: snack-size, sandwich-size, and gallon-size Ziploc bags

I spent Christmas in the hospital and New Year's in a rehab unit, feeling anything but thankful. Nearly a year later, the slow recovery continues.

Yet I see much to be thankful for: my caregiver cousin, who lengthened her stay considerably; my family; church friends who provided meals, prayers and love; and doctors and therapists, who put me back together and continue to encourage me.

As Thanksgiving approaches, I continue to work on patience but am learning — with God's help — to "give thanks in all circumstances"


HOME VISITS BY PASTOR AND/OR YOUR ELDER


