

REFORMATION PEOPLE LIVING AS A NEW CREATION

October is "Reformation Month" – a time when we as Lutherans celebrate those theological insights encapsulated in these three Latin phrases: sola fide, sola gratia, sola Scriptura. Indeed, it is through faith alone, by grace alone, through the Scriptures alone, that we have become God's children and members of the Christian Church. As such, St. Paul's words in 2 Corinthians 5:17 present the reality of God's intention, "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation..."

What that looks like is addressed in the Augsburg Confession (Article 6): "...it is necessary to do the good works commanded by God. We must do so because it is God's will, and not because we rely on such works to merit justification before God." Article 20 says also, "Our teachers teach in addition that it is necessary to do good works, not that we should trust to merit grace by them, but because it is the will of God."

Perhaps these words of Dr. Francis Rossow (former professor at Concordia Seminary), in an article in the book <u>Augsburg Today</u> are worth repeating and underscoring: "Indeed, doing good works is the will of God. Not only is it the will of God that "all people be saved" (I Timothy 2:4); it is also His will "that you should be holy." (I Thessalonians 4:3) The writer to the Hebrews prays that "the God of peace...make you perfect in every good work to do His will, working in you that which is well-pleasing in His sight." (Hebrews 13:20-21) Because of Christ's saving life, death and resurrection, God does two things to us—1. He <u>declares</u> us righteous through Christ, and 2. He <u>begins to make</u> us righteous through Christ."

Dr. Rossow goes on to explain, "We need to keep both of these activities of God in mind. Likewise, we need to see both of them in proper relationship to each other. Faith and works are a unity—you can't have one without the other. When God declares us righteous through Christ, He

at the same time begins to <u>make</u> us righteous through Christ by teaching us to do the works of faith...even though the second part of His activity has no bearing on the first. Picture faith and good works as the two blades of a scissors. Call the top blade "faith" and the bottom blade "good works." Faith and good works are two different realities, often apart from each other...but look again. The two blades are ultimately one entity, for they are joined together at the axis and so work together as a unit. Indeed, the power of either blade lies not in itself alone, but in the hand that operates the handle."

So as we move into the month of October, may we remember that it is God's hand through the Holy Spirit that supplies the power for us to meet the needs and bring Christ's loving and healing presence to those around us. May our Savior guide us, especially in these uncertain days, to open our eyes to those places and circumstances where He through St. Paul is directing us to be His "new creation."

- + We have extra flyers and posters to pass out to your family and friends or your co-workers/bulletin boards. They are located on the table by the Church Office or on the bench in the Narthex.
- + We are still in need of helpers...on Saturday (24th) and Sunday (25th) from 8am-5pm, to grill, wrap cooked chickens, distribute, etc... More details on the sign-up sheet.
- + As always, you may also buy and then donate one or more chickens to the Community Kitchen. Just note your preference on the sign-up sheet and how many you would like to donate. (Last year we donated ten (10) chickens to the Community Kitchen.)

+ Remember, this is the only time of the year you get to have chicken with Pastor's seasoning rub and his special sauce!!

*****PLEASE NOTE... We need you to place your order today or as soon as possible, as we need an estimate of the number of chckens to order. We usually order 200 chickens, but as to date only have orders for 60. If you don't place your order, we will not have extra chickens for sale that weekend.

***ALSO NOTE... Unless prior arrangements are made with Pastor or Lorilynn, any chicken orders not picked up by 5pm on Wednesday, October 28th, will be donated to the Chattanooga Community Kitchen.

Sack up anything you, your hubby, or your kids have outgrown and bring it to the church. Clothing can be of any size... bring your big and small clothes, for both males and females. Purses, bags, shoes, belts, etc... are also welcome. All clothing MUST be clean and in good condition, 'NO' mending needed. (The season of clothes you bring does not matter when you donate them, as everything and anything is needed for our homeless community.)

Doing some fall cleaning of your home? We will also take kitchenware, wall décor, lamps, bedding, towels, anything you might use to set up a house (or that will fit into the back of Arlene's SUV!), as we also help those who now are able to get into an apartment or house. All items <u>MUST</u> be in useable and non-damaged condition. Put them in a box or sack and bring them to church. Set them by the table outside the church office or on the landing at the top of the stairs (across from the church office).

Arlene Vickers will get them to various homeless agencies which she deals with. Thank you in advance for your sharing of clothing and household items with others... you are giving others a blessing that cannot be measured.





We have been praying for Pastor Jon Zehnder, nephew of Larry & Judy Zehnder, who has been hospitalized and battling COVID-19 for some time now in Florida.

On Tuesday, I received the following from Larry, which his nephew had sent out last week to reflect on his recent experience with the Covid-virus. Pastor Jon is now back home, but still quarantined. After reading Pastor Jon's reflection, take some time to think about or reflect on how each of us needs to look at life during these uncertain times!

God's Grace Still Amazes Me

There have been times in a message where I have said, "I understand that the next breath I take is only by God's grace." I learned first-hand how true that was when the Covid-virus moved from afflicting me with high temperatures to attacking my lungs. Alone, well, as alone as you can be with nurses, CNAs, and others checking on you, and while on machines assisting you to breathe – you become acutely aware of every breath you are able to take.

It's often been said that you realize that God is all you need, when God is all you've got. In my return to the hospital and the next 49 days, God, and those He sent to help me in my time of need, were what I needed. But let me add that it was also your prayers, love, encouragement and concern, added to my family's, that also gave me hope and strength.

My life was in God's hands – just as our eternal life is in His hands. God in His grace left nothing to chance or to choice. He did not require us to earn our salvation or deserve it, but He made a way to be just (since sin demanded a payment – "the wages of sin is death"; so somebody had to die, if not us then Somebody who could pay for us) and for Him to be our Justifier (the One who declares us righteous and holy in His sight because of the payment for our sins by Another – namely Jesus!).

As we approach another celebration of the Reformation, those Biblical truths that have become the bedrock of our faith still ring true: We are saved by God's Grace alone, through Faith alone, in Jesus Christ alone, which is declared in Scripture (the Bible) alone!

What a God we have! What a God we serve! Let me leave you with the words of a song that I played nearly every day while I was hospitalized — "Whom Shall I Fear" by Chris Tomlin:

"You hear me when I call, You are my morning song, though darkness fills the night it cannot hide the light -Whom shall I fear? You crush the enemy underneath my feet; You are my sword and shield, though troubles linger still - Whom shall I fear? I know Who goes before me, I know Who stands behind, The God of angel armies, is always by my side. The One who reigns forever, He is a friend of mine, the God of angel armies is always by my side. My strength is in Your Name, for You alone can save - You will deliver me; Yours is the victory...".

May the assurance of that deliverance and victory in our Savior Jesus be yours today, tomorrow and all the days to come!

WEEKLY RESERVATIONS CONTINUE...

As a reminder, for the foreseeable future, PLEASE call the church office to make reservations for Private Holy Communion on Wednesday or Saturday afternoon. We are also reminding everyone to call if you plan to attend either worship service on Saturday or Sunday.

It is very important for the church office to receive your call, especially for Holy Communion, as there are only so many open slots for communion (scheduled for every 20 minutes). In addition, we can only allow so many people per worship service (due to the 6 ft. social distancing guidelines).

Making your reservations helps the church office to complete the lists for Pastor and the Ushers, which are needed each weekend. Since COVID began, we now have a new way of keeping attendance for the Synod. When you call in, you are helping the office to complete the necessary paperwork. (You can also think of it as our way of tracking, should someone come down with COVID within the church.)

The following guidelines still apply for making your reservations for Holy Communion and our worship services by the appropriate day and time each week. (<u>Please know</u> if you accidentally forget to call in and make your reservation, you are still welcome to attend either service.)

Wednesday Holy Communion, by <u>11am on Wednesday</u> Saturday Holy Communion, by <u>4pm on Thursday</u> Worship Service on Saturday evening (6pm) -or-Sunday morning (9am), by <u>4pm on Thursday</u>

If you desire Private Holy Communion at a time different than noted above, please call the church office and speak to Pastor or Lorilynn for a reservation.

HEALTH REMINDER RE: COVID-19 //

Cross of Christ has been blessed with no COVID cases from within the church walls. We are hoping to continue this trend and ask for your help:

Within the last 48 hours of walking into the church for ANY service or meeting, please ask yourself these 5 questions:

- 1) Have you been in close contact with... someone being tested for COVID and waiting for the results -or- someone who tested positive (a confirmed case) for COVID-19? Have you traveled to a hot spot of COVID-19?
 - 2) Have you had a loss of taste or smell?
- 3) Are you experiencing a cough, shortness of breath, or sore throat or any symptoms of COVID-19?
- 4) Have you had a fever within the last 48 hours? If so, you must be fever free for 48 hours before coming into the church.
- 5) Have you had vomiting or diarrhea in the last 24 hours, or felt sick or not like yourself?

If you answered YES to any of the above questions, we ask that you please REMAIN AT HOME.

We will continue with the guidelines that everyone <u>MUST</u> wear a face mask when coming into the church, attending Private Holy Communion, or attending any gathering held on the church premises, for the foreseeable future. (Even our quilters are wearing them the whole time they are putting together quilts!) Please make sure that the mask covers your whole nose, mouth, and chin areas.

Remember to tell yourself... I am wearing a mask not because I am ill, but because I care for YOU! The last thing we want is a resurgence of this silent killer due to someone feeling that they are an exception to the rules.

Please know that the Elders and church staff are doing everything they can for the health, safety and well-being of our members and your families. We will continue to evaluate further re-opening plans, taking into consideration the current impact of the virus in our community, and the future steps which can be taken for our church to move forward. These are headlines that show up in the news daily. Do you want to learn what you can do to save someone's life? You can make the difference! This event is useful for you and your loved ones or neighbors should a medical emergency occur. Getting Certified or Recertified is as easy as taking a 2-hour class that is offered in our Fellowship Hall. Another CPR/AED Class from the American Heart Association will be scheduled in November and we would like you to attend (date TBA).

We highly encourage those who have previously taken the class, and all Board of Directors, Elders, Ushers, and those in leadership positions within the church to signup. The cost is \$35.00 and paid the day of the class, as you complete the required paperwork. We will need a minimum of 4 people to hold the class and can only have a maximum of 8 people in each class.

If you think you would be interested in attending a class, call or email Lorilynn, and let her know if a Saturday or weeknight would work best for your schedule. We can then put a date and time together for a class. (If we have enough interest, we could possibly schedule a class in October.)

Even throughout these months of the pandemic we want to thank those who continued to drop their mites into the larger Mite box located on the Narthex bench.

Some might say... what is a Mite Box? In the Bible we hear these words about... **The Widow's Mite...**

Jesus sat down opposite the place where the offerings were put and watched the crowd putting their money into the temple treasury. Many rich people threw in large amounts. But a poor widow came and put in two very small copper coins, worth only a fraction of a penny. Calling his disciples to him, Jesus said, "I tell you the truth, this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others. They all gave out of their wealth, but she, out of her poverty, put in everything — all she had to live on" (Mark 12:41–43).

Boxes are available to every woman, children, and man in our congregation. If you would like a Mite box, thy are located on top of the larger Mite box on the Narthex bench. It's those small purple and yellow boxes or there are special ones for children.

LWML Mite Boxes — Why Do I Fill Them? How Can I Fill Them?

- First and Foremost... Put the box somewhere you will see it daily.
- Put your pennies or pocket change in the box at the end of each day. (The box also accepts dollar bills.)
- Say a "thank you prayer" and drop-in some change whenever a blessing or good opportunity has been given to you or a family member/friend.
- Say a "prayer of thanks" and drop-in some change whenever a calamity or misfortune has been averted in your life or someone else's.
- Check out the attached LWML Mite Challenge Calendar for October. Post it by your box or tape it to a cabinet or wall. It will <u>daily</u> give you <u>suggestions</u> on pray, Bible readings, etc... and donation suggestions.
- Say "thank you" and "give" from your heart on a daily basis. Why? Because you are a child of God!
- Then... Deposit your "little box" donations into the "big box" at church, on the first Sunday of the month or any Sunday that works for you.

Throughout the decades, Lutheran women have stepped out in faith, setting goals, and trusting God to move the hearts of His people to give generously to LWML to proclaim the Gospel. Mite Boxes have changed in color and design over the years, but what has <u>never</u> changed is the dedication of <u>freely given offerings</u> for the purpose of reaching out to others with the Good News of Jesus Christ. We continue to reach out to others, even with the pandemic going on around us.
